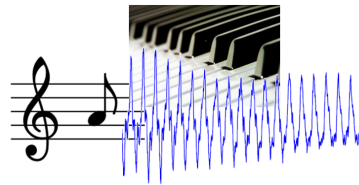


Figure 1: Example for a figure.
